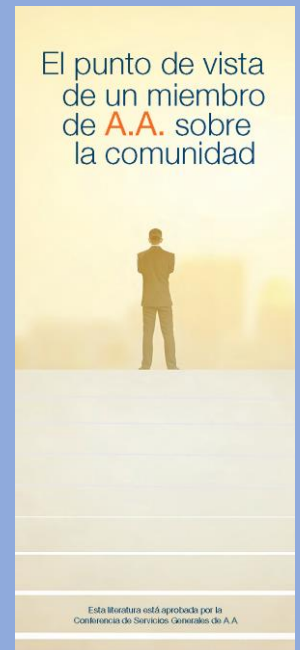
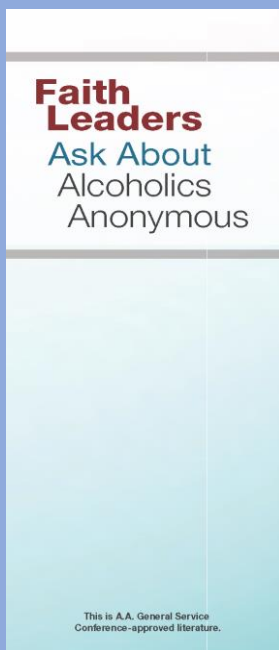


Faith Leaders
